"It has been an honor to serve Lead to Read KC for the past eight years in this role," said Hart. "My passion for children's literacy is unwavering, and I am proud of the strides we have made. The need for reading and mentoring has never been greater, and I am grateful for the tireless dedication of Kansas City's educators along with our staff, Reading Mentors and board members whose support makes the organization's mission possible."

The board of directors will lead the comprehensive search for the new executive director.
